New Guidelines regarding COVID

Before Camp

1. Each church is responsible for having each child fill out our health screening form before they arrive at camp.
2. Conduct a temperature check before they are transported to camp.

Daily During Camp

1. Each camper is required to wear a mask while indoors.
2. Temperature checks will be conducted each time anyone comes into the worship center.
3. Cabins will be at half capacity. So 1 adult for every 6-7 campers.
4. Frequent hand washing and sanitizing.
5. Isolation of any symptomatic individuals.
6. Activities will be conducted in cabin groups.
7. Seating in cafeteria and worship center will be by cabin groups.

Individuals with Symptoms

1. Any ill camper will immediately be isolated, evaluated and, if needed, arrangements made for them to return home.
2. A COVID test of a sick camper may be requested for campers who are sent home. Health insurance may cover most or all of the test; free COVID tests may also be available. Otherwise, if parents are unable to pay for the test, we ask their supporting church to offer assistance.

Individuals determined to be COVID positive

1. Any individual (camper or staff) who tests positive for COVID may result in the cabin being isolated and returned home. This decision will be made by the camp director in consultation with the camp nurse.

Staff members exposed to a COVID positive individual but not showing symptoms

1. Self-monitored, and by camp nurse, possible isolation or return home.

FAQ

Does our whole church have to go home if just one camper begins to have symptoms?

We will treat each ill camper on a case-by-case basis. It is possible that an entire church could be sent home.

What will camp look like compared to the past?

We want summer camp to be as normal as possible. All indoor activities will look different because of distancing guidelines.

- ❖ Every person will be required to wear a mask while inside and be with their cabins at all times.
- ❖ Each cabin will have their own table in the dining hall, and their own set of chairs in the worship center.
- ❖ Crafts, Bible Study, and Missions will be conducted outside or in smaller groups.
- ❖ Groups for Puppets will be smaller and socially distanced.
- ❖ Other outside activities may need to be evaluated as well.

More

- ❖ We are asking that parents/churches keep children home who have had a fever greater than 100.4 at any time during the 7 days prior to camp.
- ❖ If a camper reports being COVID positive after the camp week has ended, then we will inform the church and any others who came in close contact.
- ❖ At this time we will still allow children to leave camp for ball games or other related sports activities. We do however ask parents to help keep their children socially distanced from others as much as possible. A temperature check will be required before they are admitted back to their cabin.
